

BUSINESS OWNERS ARE OPTIMISTIC...

Despite the challenges of hiring qualified workers, 69% of all small business owners reported feeling optimistic about their growth over the next six months.




Millennials are the most optimistic:


Millennials are the most optimistic group of entrepreneurs, with 82% feeling positive about the growth of their small business over the next six months.
